heard it. However, it shouldn't be that hard for us to accept that this has happened because, in a very different but very real way, this happens every day. The world seems like someone snuck in during the middle of the night and rearranged all the prices on everything. People exchange the most valuable things in life for pennies while the most worthless smut goes for millions. The silly vanities of life are going for top dollar while the value of human life is at an all-time low. It doesn't really matter how it all started or how it got to this point, but it does matter that this is our sad reality. Because human life is regarded as worthless, people feel worthless. It is because people feel worthless that they create their own false value systems. Unfortunately, the two criteria that most of the world uses to determine value is appearance and performance. And, if you don't have either, then the world doesn't believe that you have very much value if any at all.

Thankfully, this is not how God determines the value of a person. I don't know if there is a better place in the Bible that shows how much value God has determined an individual has than in Luke 23:39-43 where Luke tells us about the thief on the cross. Time and time again, we've read the words of Paul in Romans 5:6-11 where he says that Christ died for "the ungodly," "the sinners," and those who are "enemies" of God and we think of ourselves (and we should). THIS is how WE should view other people, no matter how despicable they might seem to us. We need to see our fellow man as someone with value whether they dress in Armani or not.
